Our thermosetting TGIC polyester powder coated site furniture undergoes a two-coat process consisting of a proprietary rust and corrosion inhibiting primer/sealer coat followed by a thermosetting T.G.I.C. polyester powder coat topcoat.

Maintenance for Powder Coated finishes is as follows:

- Powder coated products should be cleaned using soft cloths and general purpose cleaner/non-abrasive commercial grade solvent.
- This finish may require touch ups over time if scratched or dented. Touch up spray paint may be ordered to color match RAL powder of the site furnishings.

If touch up spray paint is necessary, you will want to take the following steps to ensure proper coverage, adherence, and appearance: For dents and scratches where paint has been removed down to bare metal, the area may be lightly sanded to smooth the thickness of surrounding powder coating. Touch up spray paint should never be applied from the aerosol can as this will cause overspray and a visible difference in coatings. Instead, spray a desired amount into a separate small container (such as the size of the paint cap) and apply a single layer with a soft applicator (small painters sponge or Q-tip for smaller areas). Allow each coat to dry between a minimum of two applications. Be sure to allow the full unit to dry before replacing doors, lids, liners, etc. that are commonly handled and are vulnerable to more metal-to-metal chipping. As long as all "bare metal" surfaces are coated, this will prevent oxidation. For further information, please call us and we will gladly assist over the phone.
